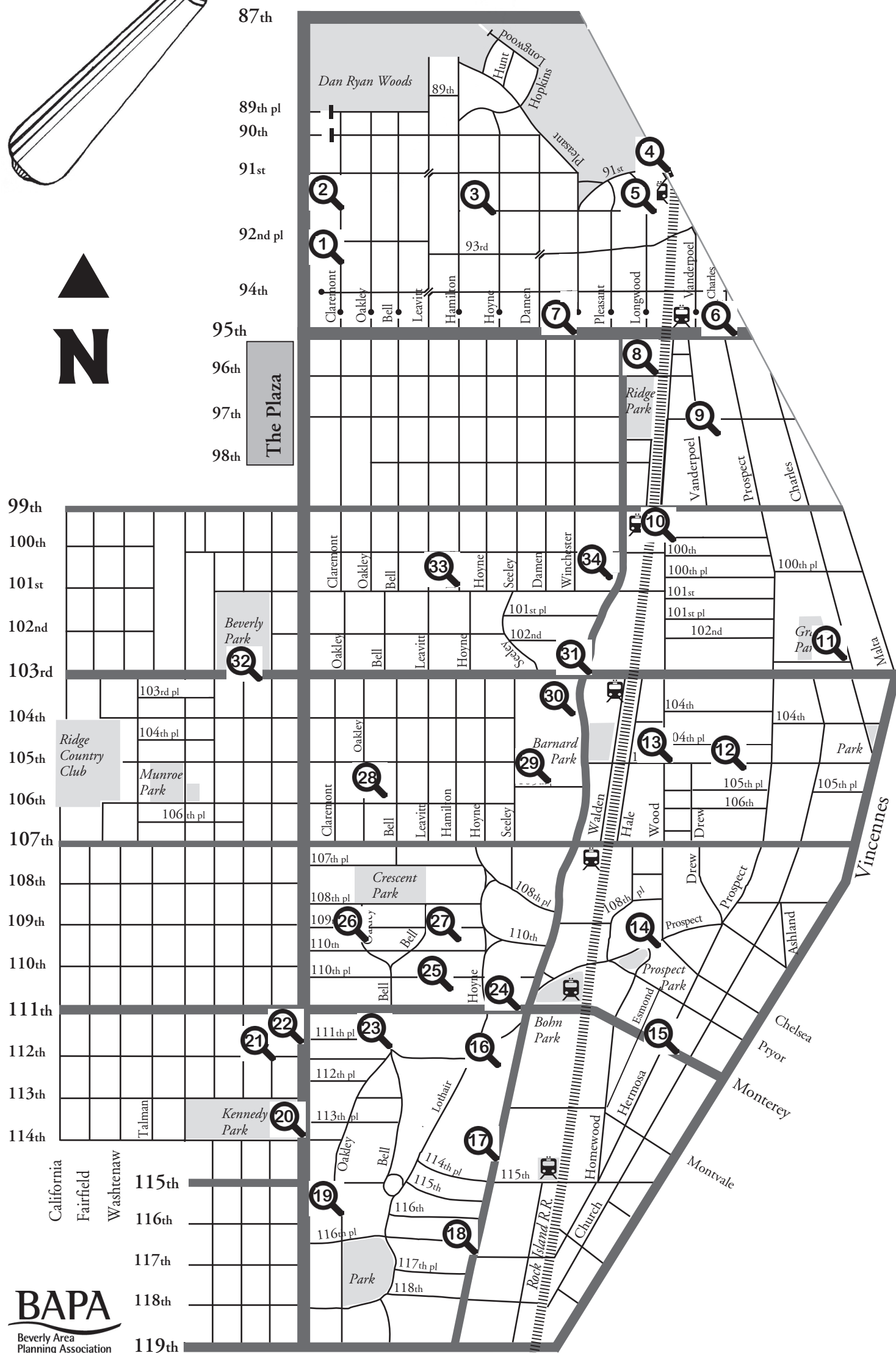
HOW TO PLAY
